#### **HEALTH AND SAFETY**

Keeping yourself safe is the most important task of the kiwi survey. Although high ground is best for kiwi listening, it's important that you prioritize your safety. Find a good spot but also a safe spot. Please complete your survey with a group in case of incidents. Take more clothing than you'll need, it gets chilly 2 hours after sunset.

#### WHAT YOU'LL BE DOING

It's good to listen to a few, because kiwi have several different calls (see websites below). Pick a site near the Kaimai Mamaku Forest and take your family or friends with you. Ensure you have all your equipment and you're in a safe spot.

Start to listen out for kiwi 30mins after sunset.

After a minimum of 2 hours, you'll have heard kiwi if any are present. Remember to listen and watch for other species (Weka, Morepork. Possum etc.) and record these too. All your observations are valuable.
